

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RIGHTSIZING AND THE IMPENDING UPCYCLE: ADAPTIVE REUSE IS KEY CHAIR'S REPORT



CHAIR'S REPORT

In July, I spent four days in Philadelphia for the BOMA International Conference. Retiring BOMA International President and Chief Operating Officer, **Henry Chamberlain** and Senior Vice President, **Mary Lue Peck**, delivered BOMA's annual State of the Industry address. They presented an in-depth look at the current state of the CRE industry and provided insight into how this time of disruption and fast-paced change is transforming commercial real estate for the long-term. One of my biggest takeaways from their remarks is that they expect it will be 2026 until the office market bottoms out and that we are 12 to 18 months from an upcycle, where historically the industry has come back stronger than before the market downturn. They added that office space is about flexibility including using 19% as lounge space for tenants. They also discussed that largely conversion to housing does not work for about 75% of office buildings. Therefore, adaptive reuse is the key to how properties are reenvisioned.

There were also some great educational seminars. Some of the most interesting content was the continued growth of Artificial Intelligence in our industry. All utilization ranges from indoors, managing HVAC and other systems, but also goes outside, using drones and All to evaluate the condition of roofs, parking lots, and loading docks. There was an interesting case study of how Walmart has used this technology to evaluate, rank and prioritize capital projects to more effectively spend precious CapEx dollars.

Kori De Jong, the board Vice-chair, our President **Tina Gassman** and Immediate Past Chair **Heide Kempf-Schwartz** also attended. It was good to see my colleagues outside of work and committee meetings.

All in all, it was a good week. It is my hope that each of you will get an opportunity to attend a future BOMA International Conference. This is a great event for property managers, service providers, and engineers.

I also want to extend a warm welcome to our new board members, Crystal Pingel who is the Senior Property Manager with Frauenshuh Commercial Real Estate, and Joe Holman, Director of New Business for Insight Restoration.

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HOW OUR CONNECTIVITY LED TO DISCONNECTION

The Opening Keynote Address at the **BOMA International Conference** in Philadelphia featured, "It's Time to Change the Channel" from Michael Smerconish, an American radio host, television presenter, political commentator, author, lawyer, and a Pennsylvania native.

Smerconish delivered an engaging, thought-provoking, and balanced presentation on today's political arena, the 2024 election, and the long-term implications of the polarization in politics.

He spoke of our current national divide, political and otherwise. For example, he said that while only 14% of us are at either extreme end of the political spectrum (the other 86% in the moderate range), our media leads us to believe we are further divided than we are.

Ironically, today's connectivity is disconnecting us through self-selecting. The internet allows us to find like-minded individuals and to actively avoid those who see things differently.

Everyone is online, but we are more disconnected from our neighbors than at any point in our modern history. Further, there is a growing class division because of our lack of cross-class friendships.

All of this self-selection and disconnection is not good for our health and happiness.


Smerconish referenced a book titled, "The Good Life: Lessons from the World's Longest Scientific Study of Happiness" by Robert Waldinger, M.D. and Marc Schulz, Ph.D.

The findings are based on a Harvard study beginning in 1938 regarding the search for happiness. It includes ongoing medical records of its subjects. Its discovery? The key to happiness is social fitness. Social relationships keep us healthy and satisfied.

Our kids are spending time alone, inside, instead of exploring outside and developing friendships around town. They are carpooling to school instead of socializing (and working out disputes) with kids on the school bus. Smerconish believes that this phone-based childhood and helicopter parenting is directly responsible for our current mental health crisis.

Our hybrid work environment, he continued, is contributing to our debilitating isolation. Smerconish pointed to an article published in the Wall Street Journal called, "The Loneliness of the American Worker" and subtitled, "More meetings and faceless chats. Fewer work friends. How the modern workday is fueling an epidemic of isolation."

Smerconish held emphatically, "I'm not saying this just because I'm speaking to [BOMA]. We've got to physically get back to work!"

Smerconish believes in-person experiences with those around us - particularly with those different than us - can foster a pathway to greater understanding and cooperation in an increasingly complex world.

"We need to mingle. We need to get out of our bubbles and have shared experiences."

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

A: We are watching "The Americans" on Netflix and it is a pretty intense series.




Q: If there was only ONE food that you could eat the rest of your life, what would it be?
