The meeting will take place at the DoubleTree Hotel, downtown Saint Paul and includes a plated lunch.



CHAIR'S REPORT BY BILL HUEPENBECKER

Dear BOMA Members.

I want to congratulate the Saint Paul Downtown Alliance for clearing the last hurdle in expanding the


Saint Paul Downtown Improvement District (SPDID.)

The SPDID provides services and programming within the public realm by supplementing government services that include the Safety Communications Center and Street Team.

Earlier this summer the Saint Paul City Council voted in favor of expanding the SPDID. However, there was a time for property owners in the new district to oppose the expansion. That window closed in September with a minimum of opposition so the expansion will become effective on

January 1, 2025.

The larger district will now move into Lowertown and now include all downtown. This will allow the Down-



town Alliance to bring on board more safety ambassadors and street cleaners that have been effectively providing service in the SPDID for the last four years. One metric that proves the effectiveness of the current District is that since its inception in 2021, there has been a 40% reduction in calls to the police for quality-of-life crimes and concerns. I am looking forward to this expanded service level and impact for more of our downtown businesses and residents in the coming year.






PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Saint Paul Building Owners: Light Up in Teal on November 1st



Each year in November is the annual "Light the World In Teal" initiative to raise Alzheimer's awareness. Buildings and landmarks around the world illuminate in the color teal. The organization has been getting major buildings, landmarks, City Halls, hotels, airports, many of the professional sports stadiums and arenas, assisted living facilities, bridges, museums, and more to participate. Last year, they had more than 1,000 buildings participate.

This year, they are hoping to significantly increase the number of participating sites in St. Paul to really make a difference. They have several buildings and prominent sites in Minneapolis, but none in St. Paul. We believe that, with increased awareness, it will get more people involved in the battle against Alzheimer's disease and even make federal governments take notice and devote more funds to Alzheimer's research and caregiver supports.

It really could be as simple as lighting one area of your building with a few colored light bulbs or a colored lamp, or if any of your buildings have it, LED lighting. It is simple and inexpensive. The sites that participate always get a tremendous amount of positive publicity for participating.

Communities affected by Hurricane Helene's disastrous strike last week are scrambling to seek support, rebuild and consider the best path forward, as many fear the likelihood of another wave of weather events impacting the Southeast. Hurricane Helene quickly moved through the region with at least five states reporting high number of fatalities in North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Virginia and Florida. According to one source, Hurricane Helene, a Category 4 hurricane with an 800-mile path of destruction, is considered the "worst event in office history" according to the National Weather Service in Greenville-Spartanburg, South Carolina.
